Newport

Not so long ago in the days of steam Williamstown and Newport through to Spotswood were a vast Victorian Government Railway complex including a power station and a hospital.

Any item that the railways required was manufactured at one of the sites, including station clocks, locks, screws, door handles, signals, platform equipment and tarpaulins being just small examples.

Tait Electric trains, swing door carriages (dog boxes), country passenger and all manner of freight rolling stock as well as a range of steam engines were produced from this site.

Today a mixture of different private companies, along with housing developments, occupy the old site and with very little left for preservation.

East Block and West Block are preserved and occupied as described.

East block contains 150 preserved W class trams along with some Tait carriages and the remainder of the space is used by Connex.

West block is taken up with Steam Rail, roads 2 to 7, 707 Operations 8 and 9 and a DERM preservation group in the next road with the remainder given over to Steam Rail.

Most of the preservation and maintenance is carried out by volunteers on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays' when there are no running days so there is always plenty to do, add running days e.g. weekends and it gets very busy. The main projects in the pipeline at the moment are the scheduled painting of the wooden carriages; these have to come in for painting and roof and interior repairs every four years.

The A2 project. This entails a complete rebuild. At the moment the boiler has been tested and passed, but a lot has to be done to the frame, tender and wheels before it can be assembled.

At the moment I am preparing fire box doors and the boiler to be painted with heat resistant paint to keep the rust away. This project has been on the go for around 15 years and is still a long way off.

Due to the poor wheat harvest, the diesels that are normally on hire are in for maintenance and a T is in being repainted and looking good. So if you think you would like something different, pop into Steam Rail and you will be made most welcome.



Diablo Mine building

These photos show the mine interior which includes the steam winches (crow river) cage and ore bucket (scratch built) mine head, ore bunker, platform and coal bin from strip wood grained and stained.

The main buildings were constructed with a core of art card covered with stripwood, windows are Barmills with Grandt doors.

The corrugated roofing is from Keiths Corrys shingles from Evergreen Hill and the tarpaper from Paper creek. The Steps are from Rusty Stumps, nuts are Grandt and Tichy. This mine was based on a plan in the Gazette some years ago bent to suit.
