

NMRA 25th Anniversary Convention Paul R.

On Thursday, October 1 Kathy and myself travelled on the Sydney Limited Overnight train with Ian and Jan Mitaxa to Sydney to attend the 25th Anniversary Convention which was held at Oakhill College, Castle Hill. We stayed at the Hotel Ibis in Thornleigh. The Organisers had a shuttle bus for the participants.

There were several Guest Speakers from the USA – Allen Pollock, National VP NMRA, Charlie Getz, Tony Koester and Al Westerfield MMR who, along with many locals, presented information on various subjects pertaining to either prototype or model subjects of interest.

There were 3 layouts on display for the weekend.

MUSKRAT RAMBLE – a freelanced 2'6" and 3' narrow gauge railroad set in southern USA during the early part of the 19th century when steam was the main motive power. The area modelled is the swamps and cotton fields of the deep south. The mansion and the town of Atchafalaya are typical of this area. Photos are included. Layout built by George Paxton MMR, Keith McCarron, Dieter Chidel, Ray Walter, Geoff Nott, and Michael Flack. Scale is "O"

CHARGING MOOSE MINING CO. scale "O" 2'6" narrow gauge. Geoff Nott & John Montgomery – builders. A mining operation set in the mountains of the Rockies USA. Photos are included.

Denver & Rio Grande Western. "Sn3" Layout by Michael Flack A lot of terrific scenes have been modelled on this layout. Photos are included.

The welcome address was by David Howarth followed by a short history of the Australian Division by Sowerby Smith (Aust President), then an address by the National VP Allen Pollock.

The opening session was by Charlie Getz well known as a writer for the NGSL Gazette among other things and an excellent orator.

The clinics I attended were "Government Regulations and car building" by Al Westerfield MMR a well known manufacturer of resin freight cars.



I had entered 2 models in the competitions and picked up 2 awards which was a bonus.

All in all a very enjoyable weekend and worth the effort. I did not do any of the layout tours as we were leaving for home the next day.



Open Day at the Invermay Ballarat Model Engineers Society Track.

On Sunday, November 15 I decided to have a look at what this group were up to as we have several members of our club are also members of the BMES. The track is situated next to the local bowling club and near the CFA shed. The track layout looks like a folded dog bone main track with 5" and 71/4" gauges, another loop has 5" and 3 1/2" gauges and a smaller loop will have 3 1/2" gauge raised track by the looks of it.

On the day they had the use of the bowling club main room with displays of many large models and a display by Gary of his small live steam and a battery loco running on a short run. A display by Peter Theobald of some of his stationary steam engines running with compressed air. A display with a King in 5" gauge surrounded by several model Rotary aircraft engines all built by John Ramm.
